Spirit of the Old West



This Spirit of the Old West gallery tells the story of the westward expansion of the United States from early 1700s to the early 1900s through historical artifacts, wildlife and a 140 foot topographical table depicting significant scenes from the Old West. It highlights the lifestyles and experiences of Native Americans of the Plains and Western pioneers, including those in California.

SCHOOL TOURS SCHEDULING REQUIRMENT

Tours are scheduled Wednesday and Thursdays during the calendar year. Tours may be guided or self-guided. The museum offers two gallery tours, per group, per day. Tours are scheduled at 10:00 AM and 12:30 PM. All tours require a minimum of 10 students. Chaperones are required for all groups at a ratio of 1:8.
